County Councillor Report for August 2017

New Station Car Park; this is now in use but some significant teething issues remain unresolved

<u>Pact matters</u>: Next meeting will be on Tuesday 26th September when we will hope to make progress on youth annoyance concerns, HGVs and speeding vehicles on Heol Isaf.

<u>Green bins and Recycling centre</u>; waste management are publicising that corrugated waste should not be put in green bins; they should be put in green bags or tied with string and placed with green bags. This is because corrugated waste causes processing difficulties in composting but also because composting costs money to dispose of a material, which fetches a good price if sold separately. The recycling centre at Lamby Way is easy to use but it is regrettable that no such facility is planned for the north of the city.

LDP issues: in addition to planned development within Cardiff, R-C-T plans a large development near Pontyclun; I have written pointing out that this will feed into the traffic logjam being created on and off Llantrisant Road. I still await answers on the investigation of flooding created by Plasdwr development.

<u>Highway matters</u>: Lower Park Road has been resurfaced and the lines replaced. Several potholes have been reported and re-filled. I still await my requested site meeting with the Cabinet Member.

Possible development at Radyr Sidings: this has not yet progressed to pre-planning consultation but it is still a live project.

Bus Service to Radyr and Morganstown; We are now getting 3 buses per hour during the week and one potential benefit of the Plasdwr development is likely to be a further enhanced service.

<u>Cwrt Brynteg</u>: at a successful meeting with residents to discuss various concerns, we agreed that this would become an annual meeting with additional meetings as necessary.
