County Councillor Report for July 2018

<u>Pavement Parking</u>: this is prevalent around Radyr Comp on Heol Isaf; frequently the pavement is blocked to the point where a pram or wheelchair is obliged to go onto the highway to get round. At the recent Pact meeting, the police confirmed that they will issue tickets to observed offenders.

<u>Street Lighting</u>: much of the installation is complete and there will be a pilot project in 2 local streets to assess the benefit of a low lighting level which is increased when a car or pedestrian triggers a proximity switch. The residents involved will be advised in advance.

<u>Plasdwr drop in;</u> the next one will be on Thursday 6th September in New School Rooms

<u>Missed waste collections</u>: I have acted to re-arrange several recent missed collections, sometimes touching the same houses on repeated occasions. I will raise this at July Council as these failures are costly as well as being annoying to residents.

<u>Cardiff Gov App</u>: Residents can get FREE handy notification reminders for their recycling and waste collections straight to their mobile devices, they can now check their Council Tax account on the go and report fly-tipping straight from the scene. To download the App visit the Google Play Store or Apple's App store, search 'Cardiff Gov' and install onto your phone. Of course residents can continue to contact C2C or me.

<u>Pub in Station Road:</u> this has planning and licensing approval subject to reasonable conditions.

<u>Waste collection strategy</u>: to increase recycling rates to the Welsh Assembly target of 70% various adjustments to the collection regime are under consideration. There will be a public consultation prior to this coming to Council for approval; I can send a brief outline on request
