When Is Plastic Fantastic?

A slightly strange title for an article I know, in view of the recent media attention focusing on the problem of plastic pollution.

So let me explain just how plastic can be fantastic and how I came to be involved in this campaign.

During the course of my daily work as a pet sitter covering Radyr and the local area, I became acutely aware of just how many pet food pouches were ending up in rubbish bags as the council were unable to recycle them. These pouches have grown in popularity over the last few years with fewer clients using the traditional tins or cardboard packets. Both wet and dry cat/dog food is now readily available in these handy plastic pouches. That is great for the pet owner, but a disaster for the environment.

If just one pet owner uses 2 pouches per day, that equals 14 per week. This in turn means over 50 per month, and over 600 in one year!

Recently when visiting a regular client she left me note asking me to wash and dry the pouches and keep them for her. Apparently she had found a way to recycle them! This was certainly of great interest to me.

I have now found out that the pouches are being recycled and money is being raised for charity at the same time. The charity is raising money for brain cancer research, and support for children, in memory of Ellie Othick-Bowmaker who passed away in 2010.

Before her death Ellie raised an astonishing £25,000 by organising fund raising events to help other children facing the same illness. The fund raising known as Ellie's Fund was continued by her mum Heather until 2017. Heather took a step back to spend more time with her family and it is now part of BTRS, Brain Tumour Research and Support Across Yorkshire.

There are over 18 different streams of plastic that can be recycled for Elliesfund. I have chosen to get involved by collecting the food pouches daily. Once enough are collected I take them to a local drop off point in Llandaff North, and they are posted off to the charity. The pouches must be clean and dry before being sent off. Once processed, the material is then turned into plastic granules which can be used to make products such as fence posts and benches.

I am also collecting bread bags for Ellie's Fund These are also turned into rigid plastic products like benches, or used as film for products such as rubbish bags.

If anyone is interested in collecting any of these items for me, that would be amazing. I am happy to collect them from the Radyr/Morganstown area.

I recently delivered my first box of over 250 pouches collected in less than a month!

Alternatively there is a collection box for the pet pouches in Village Garden and Pet Supplies, Station Rd, Llandaff North.





senior sides with the First X1 winning their division, the Under 13 and 15 girls teams proving to be the best in Wales and the Under 19s winning the T20 Welsh Cup: the first time the club has ever won a national competition. Off the field the clubhouse extension, long talked about, is finally happening thanks to many donations and grants from Cricket Wales and the Community Council.

The First X1, which is the flagship of any cricket club, led the table for most of the season, but going into the final Saturday they had slipped into second place. Whilst promotion was the ultimate goal, the players who had given so much wanted the title. Following a crushing victory, which finished at 3.30pm, it was sit and wait time. Then three hours later the news came through that our rival's opponents had held out and Radyr, by one point (280 to 279) were champions. The joy and subsequent celebrations will live long in the memory.

The Second X1 had also led their division right until the death, but a few losses, especially one to the ultimate champions, meant second place but a well deserved promotion. This was achieved on the penultimate Saturday and was no mean feat given that the side generally consisted of eight juniors and three adults. How we managed to travel away on occasions was a mystery.

The Third X1 had a slow start in a division filled with excellent, experienced teams: the side were always competitive but not able to win those tight games. However as

the season progressed they eased themselves into the season and began moving up the table. By the last Saturday they knew a victory with maximum points would see them promoted. They achieved that with the minimum of fuss with a crushing victory.

The Fourth X1 as with the other three sides were always competitive, and near the top, but a few unfortunate losses meant they ended up in a creditable mid table position. They defeated the then unbeaten champions, as well as blooding some exceptionally talented youngsters, which will hold them and the whole club in good stead for years to come.

The Radyr girls in the Under 13 and 15 age groups were just too good for Welsh opposition. In the Lady Taverners competitions they both won the local titles and subsequently flexed their muscles across teams from across the bridge. The older girls ultimately went the furthest losing in the quarter finals, having taken some significant scalps on the way. In Welsh ladies cricket Radyr is the place to be.

Then the icing on the cake: the triumph of the Under 19s who, in the semi and subsequent final, smashed their opponents from east and west Wales. The twelve lads on display were a credit to the club, showing huge commitment, massive talent and a desire to win. They are the future of the club and amazingly the vast majority are available for next year's competition. If you wish to see their moment of triumph just pop onto Twitter and look for@radyrcc.

The season continues in one way and that is in the building works for the extension to the pavilion. This will provide new changing facilities for players and officials, it will enhance what the club can offer its members and will be a fitting tribute to a fantastic season.

Given the age and value of the churches the scale of the necessary repairs is not vast but we do need to raise around £25K to be spent on each church over the next five years to ensure the buildings remain secure and watertight for future generations.

NINA THOMAS

It is with sadness that we report the death of Nina Thomas at the grand old age of 104. Nina lived for many years in the flats at the corner of Danybryn Avenue until infirmity forced her to go into a home in St Hilary, relatively recently.

Nina was born in the north of Scotland and was a practicing midwife at Guy's Hospital in London at the outbreak of the Second World War, working a great deal in the east end of London. She recorded her memories of working as a midwife in Guy's in Wartime Memories, a book produced by the R&M Community Council to mark the 60th anniversary of the ending of WW2. Although now out of print it can be downloaded, free of charge, from the History Society pages on the Community

website. In fact Nina's Memories could easily have been the source material for the BBC drama series Call the Midwife.

After the war she moved to Cardiff with her husband who was a G.P in the Ely area.

Her daughter Liz Davies still lives in Radyr. We send our condolences to Liz and the family.

Community Council News

First of all, I hope you all had a good summer and a nice holiday preferably somewhere hot - and far away from the woes of Brexit, work and the Llantrisant Road traffic lights.

We've been working hard over the summer, developing a number of projects across Radyr and Morganstown. These include:

Cardiff Council has invited us to submit ideas for its new infrastructure ideas list. These will be projects that Cardiff can fund via Section 106 Money (which is provided by housing developers, as part of their planning consent deals). We have gathered residents ideas via an online survey and via the RMA. We also have our own ideas! This is a very exciting opportunity for R&M - and we will publish our contribution to the list in the near future. New ideas can be submitted at any time, since Cardiff will be keeping their list as a 'live' document. This needs a health warning, however, since it is unlikely that every idea will be accepted by Cardiff for funding. But if we don't submit any ideas - we won't get any money! We will also be meeting Cardiff's Section 106 team in the near future, to press our case.

Road safety: we had an excellent meeting with Cardiff Council's Transportation team on 10 September. We discussed several items, including the imminent installation of a Nextbike stand outside McColl's on Station Road (with more stands being considered, including electric bikes at Radyr Station). Start of works is planned for Jan / Feb 2020 for our three new **zebra crossings**, near Heol Syr Lewis, Ty Mynydd Close and Rectory Close. The legal preparations are underway to introduce a 20mph zone across all of R&M (apart from Parc Radur). The scheme should be introduced in spring / summer 2020. Golf Club Lane is to be closed - with work carried out in summer 2020. And the Council has asked us to propose improvements to the Station Road area, to improve its role as a place for the community to meet, shop and socialise. We will be conducting an online survey about this, soon, to seek views and ideas from residents. And we have, of course, expressed our

concerns about the Llantrisant Road traffic lights. You can visit the News section of our website to read more about the meeting.

Cardiff is consulting on a **new primary school** to be built on the Plasdwr site. This will be a bilingual school, with English and Welsh language streams. Again, you can read more about this on our website.

The **Old Church Rooms** has had a minor upgrade over the summer, with the installation of oak-effect floor tiles in the main hall. We think it makes the room look bigger, better and lighter. It will also be much easier for hall users to clean after their events. No more gouging Camembert from carpet tiles after cheese and wine parties. No more dabbing at red wine stains with a wet cloth. Simply mop and sweep! We have also been discussing buying a **new piano** for the hall - which would please those groups who use the OCR for choir practice and concerts.

In the near future we will be considering the provision of facilities, activities and support for our young people. This work will be undertaken in liaison with a number of agencies and organisations - as well as young people from across R&M. We want them to enjoy a range of activities and to have good places to socialise whilst sharing the values that help make R&M a great place to live.

We have responded on our website to the arson attack on a bird hide located in Forest Farm. Although this is not in Radyr and Morganstown, it is an area enjoyed by members of our community. It is a great pity that some people think that setting fire to a community resource is something worth doing - and it is difficult to believe that they have any respect for their community and neighbours. They may also be unaware of the penalties they could face, if caught. These are set out in the Sentencing Council's Sentencing Guidelines. A fire such as this one, causing moderate damage to a public amenity, can result in a prison sentence ranging from 6 to 26 weeks. Similar penalties exist for criminal damage. Anyone with any information about the attack should contact the police.

Finally, I am very pleased to announce the appointment to our team of **two**

new members. Joining us as a councillor for the Morganstown ward is Vina Patel. Vina is already an active member of our community - and we look forward to benefiting from her experience as we develop our work. We also welcome Michelle Lenton-Johnson to our team. Although not a councillor, she will join us in our council meetings - bringing her valuable local knowledge and her tremendous enthusiasm to our work. Welcome both!

Remember, Remember.....

Some thoughts for Remembrance Sunday from our Vicar, the Revd. Vicki Burrows.

Dear Friends

I regularly struggle to remember where I left my car keys but thankfully there are things I cannot forget.

One of my earliest memories is seeing my father grieve. He never spoke of his escape from the pogroms in Poland or the journey his Jewish family made to the UK seeking asylum. I remember seeing tears roll down his face as he watched a holocaust documentary and I will never forget the silent tears he shed when Olga, the only cousin to survive Auschwitz, died.

Some years ago as I conducted a Remembrance service I watched a little girl, in a poppy red coat with a black velvet collar and wet cheeks, bravely plant a small poppy cross for her father in Royal Wootton Bassett's "Field of Remembrance". As the BBC and paparazzi cameras whirred and clicked she stood silently amongst thousands of crosses and my own eyes filled as I recognised in her loss the huge and personal cost of working for peace.

For Christians painful remembering is at the heart of our faith. We break bread and share wine as we remember a life lived and sacrificed for others - perhaps it is this remembering that helps us try to love our enemies and seek justice for all.

I hope you will join us in remembering those whose lives have been given or scarred by conflict by gathering at Radyr's war memorial and joining us in church for a Remembrance Service on 10th November


