Food collections. Vicki has noticed that the food being left at The Rectory for distribution to local families via the Primary Schools (which is still needed) has become very variable (and with some strange items being donated!). Vicki thought it would be good idea to give you a little list of what goes down well.

Kids love: Juice, biscuits crisps, jam/spreads for sandwiches. **Families would like** pasta, rice, tomato sauces, tinned tomatoes, fruit, rice puddings, custard in tins/boxes, tinned tuna, sweet corn, cereal and breakfast food plus tea, coffee and sugar. In fact, just think about those things you might use from tins and packets to make a meal from scratch for a young family...
