## STOP PRESS – CHANGES TO SERVICES

Dear All

I am sorry to fill your inbox in one of the busiest weeks of the year but yesterday the Church Wardens, PCC Secretaries and Ministry Team of the Parishes of Radyr and St Fagans & Michaelston-Super-Ely have met on Zoom to discuss the recent government announcements and the advice we received from the Church in Wales.

Although we have now entered the highest alert level for Coronavirus in Wales we are not required to close our churches but to consider reducing the number and frequency of services offered so that those who wish to do so may worship safely. The current situation has led us to think very carefully because we want to meet your spiritual needs but also give you the opportunity to worship in a Covid secure church.

Since it is unlikely that the current restrictions will be lifted soon we have reviewed our service schedule both for Christmas and the coming weeks, and possibly months, ahead.

Please note you are always welcome to worship in any of our churches at any time

I am sorry if the service you usually attend has been cancelled but I trust you will understand that this decision has not been reached lightly but after much thought.

Additionally, you will be pleased to hear that it is our intention to provide some services on line - these will include recordings of Sunday services uploaded to YouTube or Facebook, occasional Zoom services and, possibly, Compline or special services on Feast Days. If you or anyone you know is in pastoral need do please be in touch with me - I am keenly aware that this latest lockdown has added to the suffering of many people. Naturally, we were all looking forward to spending time with loved ones and understand that this lost opportunity will have an impact on the spiritual and mental health of many. Please don't suffer in silence, we are here to listen and support you. Whilst it feels as if we are a long way from the joy and blessings of a "normal" Christmas, I continue to remind myself that it was into this broken and messy world that God made himself known to us as a vulnerable infant, a man who spoke truth to power and One who gave up all he had that others might live. So whilst we are feeling the sacrifice and pain of separation from loved ones let's pause to give thanks for those who will be working on the frontline in our hospitals and nursing homes this Christmas - this year like no other we have depended on the efforts of so many key workers so let's now as God's children both give thanks for them and do our bit for the common good..
