Many of you will know Trystan - he is a tutor in applied theology at St Padarn's, honorary senior lecturer at Cardiff University, and Priest in Charge of Roath Park. He is also canon theologian of Llandaff Cathedral and has been a regular contributor to BBC Radio 2 and 4. In this book, Trystan challenges us to see that Lent is not about giving up or taking up but a radical opening up: the opening of our lives to God's transformative kingdom. Through practical daily devotions he calls on us to open our eyes to God's presence, our ears to his call, our hearts to his love, our ways to his will our actions to his compassion and our pain to his peace.

As deaths from Covid-19 sadly pass the 100K mark, we thought people might be interested in a talk that will be given to the Radyr & Morganstown Association **via Zoom starting at 7:30pm this Monday, 1**<sup>st</sup> **February**. Radyr resident, Emeritus Professor Simon Smail, CBE, has titled his talk '*Epidemics, Public Health and COVID*'. Professor Smail has had a most distinguished career including a period as Vice-Chairman of the Public Health Wales NHS Trust, Vice-Chairman of Leonard Cheshire Disability and (some years ago) being the 'Radio Doctor' for Radio Wales and presenting some health TV programmes on Channel 4. He is therefore superbly placed to talk about the current virus, how it has been dealt with, and where it is going – all within the context of previous challenges such as Spanish Flu and AIDS.
