#### A message from Vicki:

Dear Friends

Many of you know I was appointed as both Vicar of The Parish of Radyr and your Ministry Area leader in 2019. The Ministry Area Transitional Team (MATT) gathered this week on Zoom to begin the process as directed by Llandaff Diocese to formalise our Ministry Area as a registered charity by early 2022. At present the four parishes of Pentyrch & Capel Lanilltern, Radyr, St Fagans & Michaelston-Super-Ely, and Tongwynlais are known as the 'North West Cardiff Ministry Area'. Each parish is represented on the MATT by two lay people plus their parish priest. Our first meeting was an opportunity to get to know one another and to share our hopes and concerns for the future. I am delighted that each of the parishes is represented by able individuals who will bring your worries and fears as well as your vision to our discussions. Meeting on Zoom is not easy for any of us but we took time to listen and learn from each other. In the coming months we will communicate with you regularly as we work through some of the issues and seek to ensure the best possible governance and care for our churches and people – now and in the years to come. Even at this point in the process I would like to assure you that worship, ministry, stewardship and finance, along with the day to day operations in each parish church, will not seem very different. Our churches will not lose their identities, nor their assets, or be subsumed into a greater whole. The members of our team are keen to preserve the identity of each church. I hope you will continue to give your time, talents and financial offerings to your local church. However, in addition to this, we hope that in the years to come we will develop new and creative ways to share and express our faith across the Ministry Area. Perhaps the 1Family Cardiff project is just one example of what can be achieved when churches work together to grow the Kingdom of God?

Since the 'North West Ministry Area' does not seem to describe our parishes well, we are looking for a new name and I would like to invite you to submit your ideas. So far we have received a number of suggestions including: 'All Saints', 'The Garth', 'Good Shepherd', 'Taff Ely', 'The Castles' and 'The One Church' Ministry Area. What do you think of those suggestions and can you do better? Would you please let your PCC Secretaries know your thoughts and ideas for a new name by 28<sup>th</sup> February at the latest? The MATT will choose from the names you offer in addition to these at our next meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> March.

Although the move from the Parish to the Ministry Area system will provide us with new opportunities, I do not underestimate the concern you may be feeling. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you wish to discuss these or have particular matters you wish the MATT to consider.
