MINISTRY AREA UPDATE - A message from Vicki

Dear all,

After many weeks of discussion, firstly with Bishop June back in July and subsequently in September with Rod our new Archdeacon, I am both disappointed and sad to share with you the news that despite my very best efforts we will only be permitted to advertise two full time stipendiary posts for priests to serve alongside me in The Garth Ministry Area. I tried very hard to convince +June that we needed 3 other clerics in addition to myself to serve the 8 churches, 11 schools, and our large and growing population but despite this I am told that each ministry area will be allotted only 3 priests. I feel we deserved to be evaluated not just on past performance but on the mission opportunity that we have with Plas Dwr and the growing new estates. Our parishes collectively have a high density of population and opportunity which I believe is unique. Archdeacon Rod also believes that in an ideal world we would have a team of five but financial resources are finite. I know this will be a disappointment to you but there is some good news.

The Rev'd Steve Willson who joined us as an Interim Priest has indicated to myself and +June that he wishes to remain in our Ministry Area. The Rev'd Lindsay Ford, a priest in retirement, who has been supporting us since Zoe and Michael moved on has also indicated that wishes to continue to serve alongside the stipendiary team. I am so pleased that both Steve and Lindsay will remain with us.

This means that in the coming weeks we will be advertising just two posts and I am expecting that Steve and one other full time priest will be licensed early in 2022.

In the coming weeks you will be hearing more.

I know you will be wondering what this means to "your church/parish". Each of our current parishes will have a priest to whom they can turn for pastoral care and one who will take most of their Sunday services along with the baptisms, weddings and funerals. The three full-time clergy will share the particular gifts they have over a wider area. It is likely that one will focus on Increasing our Capacity for Good, outreach engagement and social responsibility plus comms. This person will focus on new projects and improved communications in the MA. Another priest will focus on Young Faith Matters ie. Children, Youth and Families, schools and Education ...this is likely to sit with me in Radyr alongside the Ministry Area Role. A third priest will be involved in Telling the Joyful Story - mission and evangelism, making new disciples working with Lay Ministers offering adult education etc across the MA but especially focusing on the new housing. Finally a fourth person who may be our retired priest, working alongside Belinda, our curate in training, will focus on well-being - the spiritual and mental health of us all. This role will include the setting up of effective pastoral teams of lay people to minister alongside the clergy providing support to the sick and vulnerable, the elderly and those in nursing/care homes.

Please continue to pray for The Garth Ministry Area as it takes shape and for our future life together as we seek to live and share the gospel.
