Ministry Team

The licensing service on 24th July at Christ Church was a very enjoyable occasion and it's been great to have lan and Sandra working with us over the summer. Rev'd Ruth Coombs was a late addition to those we were going to license after Bishop June offered us the chance to add Ruth's talents to our team. Unfortunately, Ruth wasn't able to participate in the service as she got covid at just the wrong time (is there a right time to get covid?!). However, Ruth was subsequently licensed at a separate service in the Bishop's Chapel and will join us on 9th October when she is back from holiday. It remains the bishop's intention to also licence Jennie Willson as Lay Minister but that hasn't been possible yet due to pressure of other things. We have a team day planned for Saturday 22nd October where we can get to know each other better and develop our working relationships.

Please continue to pray for The Garth's Ministry Team as our new colleagues settle into their roles and we gel together as a team.

Changes in the Diocese

The Senior Staff team of the Diocese have had their hands full of late with the Archdeacon of Margam, Michael Komor, also filling in as Acting Dean of the Cathedral while the appointment of a new Dean was arranged. This of course meant he also had to deal with the Service of Thanksgiving for the life of the Queen at Llandaff. He will probably be relieved that the appointment has now been made and Canon Richard Peers, currently Sub Dean at Christ Church Oxford, will be installed at the Cathedral on Sunday 20th November.

We will, however, have further changes to adjust to as Bishop June has announced her intention to retire in December. This is not unexpected but means that we should pray for those who will help prepare for the new appointment and for the Electoral College members who will make that appointment in due course.

Positive Co-operation

There has been quite a lot going on behind the scenes in recent weeks which has included some good examples of how our increased working together across the Ministry Area has been beneficial. The MA Council set up a Digital Communications Workgroup which was tasked with developing a MA website incorporating the good material on our existing websites. This will save money, improve links across the MA and improve communication.

This group is working together well and proceeding quickly - hopefully the new website will be up and running by the end of the year. In the meantime, Radyr have helped out Pentyrch by enabling the existing Pentyrch Churches site to be hosted through the same site as Radyr (saving the additional cost of it being hosted elsewhere). In an equally helpful manner Danescourt and Radyr were looking to improve their booking literature for their halls and were able to draw on work Pentyrch had already done for Creigiau Church Hall! Happy Days!
