## RADYR WOODS IS 'THRIVING' SAYS THE RHS 'Its Your Neighbourhood' campaign report

On 4<sup>th</sup> July Radyr Woods was visited by a Wales in Bloom assessor who was shown around our Community Nature Area as part of the 'It's Your Neighbourhood" scheme - effectively a Royal Horticultural Society backed 'Wales In Bloom" for woodlands. After considering factors such as community participation, environmental responsibility and gardening achievement, the Woods scored 80 points out of a possible 100. This earned a classification of 'Thriving", and was only 6 points away from 'Outstanding" - the highest of the 5 categories available. The assessor was particularly impressed with how tidy the Woods were, which she thought was a tribute to the respect shown for the woods by the local



community, as well as the maintenance activity of the Friends of Radyr Woods (which includes the litter picker rota to deal with the small amount of litter that is a feature of all public spaces). As time constantly changes both the natural environment and the availability of people to look after it, the need for new volunteers is ever present. 
