RADYR FESTIVAL 2017

PLASDWR (WATER PALACE)

Sorry to bring this up so early in the Newsletter but Cardiff Council gave the go-ahead to this scheme on 15th March. Redrow have erected their advertising board in the large field along the A 4119 between the Heol Isaf and Parc Radur roundabouts, and the hedges that surround the field have already been cut down. The initial development will be around 150 dwellings.

There are several immediate consequences associated with this development. There will certainly be increases in construction traffic, traffic congestion and the levels of general pollution; these will continue and most probably increase. Furthermore, the longer term increases in population will certainly have an adverse effect on Radyr and Morganstown and other local Communities.

It would appear that all the representations made by many bodies against this development have been in vain. The underlying theme has been the lack of supportive infrastructure. How will the offspring be educated and where? Currently, the Medical and Dental Facilities are very stretched. This winter has also seen the local hospitals fully occupied with great difficulties in admitting very ill patients. Again, how are all the area residents going to access commercial centres, motorways and employment venues given the current inadequate roads and resulting road congestion? A well known commentator once remarked that 'If the thinking was correct, the doing was relatively easy. If the thinking was incorrect, the doing was almost impossible'.

Yet, the powers that be are confident that all will be well. Actions will involve increases in bicycle access and egress, more public transport and ultimately (possibly) 'the Metro'. The lack of publication of the other important concerns mentioned earlier speaks volumes.

We await the outcome with trepidation – not just for ourselves but for the residents who will occupy the new properties. Will their experience live up to the rosy picture being painted by Redrow? Cardiff's LDP is due for review next year: there may be a change in the ruling party of Cardiff Council come the May election. The whole development may not happen. Whatever the case and whatever our current fears, we will seek to work with our new neighbours - or extended community - to make them welcome in R&M and fight for the facilities they will want and we still need.

MAY ELECTIONS

To add to the above, don't forget that the May elections cover both Cardiff Council and our own Community Council. Why not get involved and put yourself up for election?

STATION PARKING

Work on building the new station car park on De Clare Drive is proceeding very quickly. Large sumps were dug for drainage and these are now being backfilled. We spoke to one of the engineers working on the Site who said work might be completed by the end of the month.

HANGING BASKETS: We are very pleased to say that the Community Council have again agreed to contribute to the provision of hanging baskets in Station Road. They will be put up as soon as the plants and the weather allow. In the meantime, here is a







reminder of what the baskets looked like last year.

GELYNIS FARM FOOTBRIDGE - GOOD NEWS FOR CYCLISTS AND WALKERS

Having carried out emergency repairs some time ago, when the footway was found to be defective, the footbridge was shut on 20th February for three weeks to allow permanent repairs to be made and the footway widened. It was not wide enough for two people to pass comfortably and impossible if there was a bike.

Due to a complication of the design and a requirement for additional works, the reopening has been delayed and it will probably open sometime around 17th March. The current diversion, up to the Radyr Station bridge, is a mile each way and shows how valuable this bridge is to the community.



GAREL RHYS

We were so shocked to hear of the death on 21st February of Professor Garel Rhys CBE. He was our speaker at the last General Meeting just two weeks before. If you missed that meeting, you missed a treat. Garel was knowledgeable – immensely so – amusing, possibly slightly controversial, and an incredible speaker. The R&M Community has lost a great character, and so have Wales and the UK as he was a foremost authority on the motor industry and the Welsh economy. At a time of Brexit (about which he spoke), the selling of Vauxhall and Opel to Peugeot and Citroën and other uncertainties in the Welsh economy, we need people like Garel who can provide honest, wise counsel, simply expressed. He will be sorely missed. Our thoughts go out to his wife, Mavis, and the whole family.
